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Agreement to participate in drug and alcohol rehabilitation

As part of its commitment to safety, transport agencies require that their contractors be drug and alcohol free at work. The transport agency has to be satisfied that you are able to comply with this requirement before it will issue you with a RISI Card. You are therefore offered the opportunity to satisfy the transport agency's fitness requirements by undergoing a comprehensive rehabilitation program.

The program requires a minimum of 12 months of supervised rehabilitation comprising:

- Medical assessment by an Authorised Health Professional (AHP) at 0, 6 and 12 months. More frequent reviews may be required by the AHP or by the Chief Health Officer if clinically indicated.
- Attendance at drug and alcohol counselling for a minimum of 3 sessions or as recommended by the AHP. The counsellor must forward a detailed report to the AHP and to the Chief Health Officer following each counselling session.
- Completion of additional treatment as recommended by the AHP, counsellor and/or treating doctor.
- Regular random urine drug and/or alcohol breath testing. If your employer has a drug and alcohol testing program the drug and/or alcohol tests may be conducted as part of this program. Alternatively testing may be arranged by the AHP. If drug or alcohol testing is being arranged by the AHP the medical centre will contact you randomly during the rehabilitation program and you will be required to attend for a drug and/or alcohol test within the following 24 hours. If you will be unavailable to be tested at any time during the rehabilitation program it is your responsibility to inform the AHP in advance of the dates that you will be unavailable.
- In the case of alcohol rehabilitation, blood testing will be conducted at intervals determined by the AHP and the Chief Health Officer.
- Consent for the AHP and the Chief Health Officer to exchange medical information with your treating doctor(s) and with rehabilitation professionals if needed.

The Chief Health Officer will make the final determination regarding your fitness and may discontinue the rehabilitation program if progress is not being demonstrated. Grounds for discontinuing the rehabilitation program may include but are not limited to: a further positive alcohol or drug test, failure to supply a sample, failure to attend for testing within the required timeframe, failure to attend scheduled appointments or to undertake recommended treatment.

I have read and understood the requirements of the transport agency's drug and alcohol rehabilitation program and wish to participate. I give consent for the Authorised Health Professional supervising my rehabilitation and for the Chief Health Officer to consult regarding the management of my rehabilitation and to exchange medical information with rehabilitation professionals that I have consulted and with my treating health professionals listed below.
