Needlestick Injuries

Target audience:

Sydney Trains' workers, including contractors, who work in locations or are involved in work activities that may potentially result in needlestick injuries.

The Issue

A needlestick injury to a customer was reported at approximately 7:50a.m on 30 January 2023. Initial indications are that the injury may have resulted from a damaged Sharps Container located in a toilet facility at Central Station.

What you must do

This event highlights the importance of assessing the integrity of Sharps Containers and immediately isolating damaged containers that present a hazard and also provides a timely reminder of the following key principles:

Always:

- handle sharps in accordance with the relevant Safe Work Instruction e.g. <u>D2015/37072 Handling Sharps</u>;
- ensure regular Workplace Inspections are conducted in accordance with the <u>SMS-16-OP-3076 Inspection</u> <u>Testing and Monitoring procedure;</u>
- report work health and safety related hazards as per <u>SMS-06-OP-3028 Reporting and managing Work</u> Health and Safety (WHS) hazards;
- ensure damaged Sharps Containers are removed and replaced by authorised and competent parties;
- dispose needles into an approved sharps disposal container;
- ensure appropriate equipment such as gloves, safety glasses, tongs and sharps containers are used when handling needlesticks;
- use scrapers to remove rubbish between seats;
- wear suitable Personal Protective Equipment (e.g. gloves) when removing/ handling sharps;
- identify the object before handling or retrieving the object;
- hold rubbish bags by the handles or at the top of the bag.

Never:

- reach into an area that you can't see;
- pick up needles or sharp objects unless you have the appropriate PPE;
- physically compress rubbish bags;
- hold rubbish bags by the base of the bag.

If a person sustains a needlestick injury:

- Gain assistance from a first aid attendant as required;
- All staff and contractors who sustain a sharps injury in which there is any risk of contamination must either attend a Medical Centre or a Medical Practitioner for assessment and advice;
- Ensure the incident is reported as per the defined processes in <u>SMS-17-SP-3077 Incident Notification</u>, Reporting and Investigations.
